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3. **Outline**

This course is intended for undergraduate students of the Public Administration Department planning to conduct an independent research. It illuminates how scientific and applied research is created, and introduces quantitative and qualitative methods used in research in public administration. The course describes the research design process and emphasizes practical application of the research methods in public administration. A variety of examples is provided to help in gaining better understanding of the research methods and to provide students with the skills of data management, the evaluation of public programs and reform projects. The course challenges students to develop critical thinking and better understanding of the data, so that they be able to make better decisions in their future workplace.

Upon completion of this course students will be able to (1) understand the basic principles and methods of the applied research in public administration; (2) know a variety of research methods, including statistical analysis, survey, interview, case studies, and the use of documentary sources; critically evaluate own research and propose possible directions for further study; (3) develop the research proposal for qualification projects in public administration that is theoretically and methodologically informed.
