

Summer schools

1. [Security Governance & Conflict Resolution Summer School](#)

Where: University of Amsterdam

Dates: from June, 14 till July, 2 2020

Deadline: February, 1, 2020 or April, 1, 2020

Topics: international security, new wars, human security, “responsibility to protect”, development, human rights, national security in a globalising world, private security companies, gated communities, and security initiatives

Tuition fee: €1700 - this includes trips to Brussels, The Hague, and various (inter)national organizations; housing fee is €500 - 650 and €75 refundable deposit

This three-week programme will give students an in-depth look into the ways in which thinking and speaking about security have changed over time, and how stakeholders on various levels deal with conflicts and security, ranging from the international arena to the state and from private security companies to communities and individuals. While at the University of Amsterdam, participants will hear from experts in a variety of related fields and gain a solid theoretical basis from which to explore these topics.

2. [Machine-Learning for the Social & Behavioural Sciences Summer School](#)

Where: University of Amsterdam

Dates: from July, 19 till August, 6 2020

Deadline: February, 1, 2020 or April, 1, 2020

Topics: Introduction to data wrangling, data visualization and machine learning models using the programming language Python

Tuition fee: €1600 including lunch on class days, all course materials, excursions and events; Housing fee (optional) €500 - 650

This three-week programme will give students a solid introduction to data analysis using the easy and widely used programming language, Python. The structure of the course is such that students learn about a new method or skill in the morning lecture and then immediately apply them in a practical session in the afternoon, thereby ensuring that students acquire hands-on knowledge they can apply to their own research questions. The practical sessions consist of data analysis problems based on real data taken from the social and behavioral sciences, such as the European Social Survey, data from social media (Twitter and LinkedIn), questionnaire data, and time series collected with the Experience Sampling Method (ESM).

3. [Comprehensive Introduction to Research Methodology and Design Summer School](#)

Where: University of Amsterdam

Dates: from July, 19 till August, 12 2020

Deadline: February, 1, 2020 or April, 1, 2020

Topics: participant observation as a key element of ethnographic research, the interview, and the focus group discussion, anthropology, sociology or political science
Tuition fee: €1600 including lunch on class days, all course materials, excursions and events; Housing fee (optional) €500 - 650

This course aims to lay a solid, diverse and integrated foundation for conducting first-rate qualitative and quantitative research, and for embedding it in effective and feasible mixed-method research designs. At the end of this summer programme, students will have a good understanding of the most important principles and practices of social science research. They will also be able to improve their knowledge and skills independently after the course, and thus pursue their substantive research interests without methodological hindrance. This programme begins with the presentation and discussion of the most important qualitative methods for all students in the social and behavioural sciences. We then focus on the inferential possibilities and limitations of various research strategies, introducing students to the crucial issues of research design.

4. [Summer University: The Politics of Nationalist Mobilization](#)

Where: Central European University, Hungary, Budapest

Dates: 22-26 June, 2020

Deadline: February, 14, 2020

Topics: migration, territorial and supra-territorial governance, political science, international relations, anthropology, philosophy, sociology, law and public policy

Tuition fee: €350 (early birds fee €300)

The course provides an overview of the main topical issues and scholarly perspectives on the politics of nationalist mobilization in the contemporary world. The main aim of the course is to explore the dynamics of nationalist revival in Europe and beyond. Through the comparative analyses of different cases in and outside Europe, the course seeks to investigate the social, political and economic contextual variables that facilitate (and, indeed, hinder) nationalist mobilization. The main objective of the course is to test theories of nationalist contention in comparative analysis in order to find out when, why and how nationalist claims making succeeds or fails. In order to complement the macro-political dimension of nationalist mobilization, the course will also incorporate bottom-up micro-sociological perspectives (everyday nationhood, national indifference) to investigate how nationalist politics impact (or fail to impact) the everyday life and behavior of citizens.

Main requirements: The awards are open to overseas nationals commencing a PhD in any field of study in 2020-2021. Applicants must be of outstanding academic merit and research potential.

The University of Edinburgh will not generally consider candidates who have already obtained a PhD, or formal equivalent, as a result of direct research training. Students already on a PhD programme cannot be considered for these awards.
