Our students have had internship placements at various organisations including at the OSCE Academy (Kyrgyzstan), Institute for War and Peace Reporting, Institute of Demographic Research RAS (Russia), PaperLab (Kazakhstan), OSCE High Commissioner for National Minorities (The Hague).

The rigorous conceptual and methodological design of the programme means that it is accessible to strong students from all academic backgrounds and with different levels of professional experience.
