Application Procedure

Prospective Incoming Students	 The partner university selects students for the exchange program and nominates them for the exchange semester stay via the web-based platform "moveonnet" (=eNomination). After an acknowledgement-email from TUM, the International Office of the home university sends the application documents to TUM. Applications should include the following documents: Online application: Will be released here approximately one month prior to the application deadline: https://www.international.tum.de/en/exchangestudents/; printed and signed by applicant and bearing a stamp and signature from the International Office of the partner university. One page letter of motivation (either in German or English) Curriculum Vitae (either in German or English) Photocopy of your passport/ID card Study Plan (signed and stamped by a departmental coordinator of the students' home institution) An official transcript of records (all grades attained at university), signed and stamped by the students' home institution Document listing the courses students are attending in their current semester (and therefore are not yet listed in the transcript). Language certificate (confirmation) for English and/or German (B2 CEF). The home university can issue this confirmation.

Visa Requirements/ Residence Permit Application

Entry Regulations	Applicants from EU/EFTA nations as well as some other nations do not need a visa to study in Germany.
	Applicants from Non-EU nations normally need a visa to study in Germany. In order to get a visa and the information if they need a visa, they must contact the embassy or consulate of the Federal Republic of Germany in their home country to ask and apply for it. Application for visa is necessary at least 2 months ahead of time. Students
	cannot travel to Germany on a tourist visa, since this cannot be changed into a student visa! Students that are in Germany on a tourist visa are not entitled to study there.

Are students required to get health insurance?	Health insurance is compulsory in Germany. Students cannot register at TUM without proof of German national insurance. To ensure that coverage is sufficient to meet German national standards, it is recommended that students purchase an in-country medical insurance plan.
