## Registration and nomination deadlines

<b>General information</b>	WU only accepts exchange students nominated by their home universities. The home university exchange coordinator is responsible for <b>nominating students online</b> and forwarding WU's <b>Nomination Letters</b> to the nominated exchange students.
<b>Online nomination</b>	Partner universities are asked to send an email to WU coordinators, indicating the number of students they wish to nominate, after which the online nomination link will be provided.

<b>Language requirements</b>	Depending on the language of instruction (English or German), <b>undergraduate</b> exchange students must have a B2 level or above (according to the <a href="#">Common European Framework of Reference for Languages</a> , CEFR) in English OR German. <b>Graduate</b> exchange students must have a level equivalent to C1 of the CEFR.  WU does not request official language certificates, as we trust our partners to only send students who fulfill the aforementioned criteria. However, if students do not meet the language requirements, we reserve the right to exclude them from courses.

## Course information

<b>Courses in English</b>	Our English-taught course options for exchange students include more than 250 courses offered each term, covering all core fields of business and economics as well as related areas. Some courses are offered in block format to make scheduling easier.
<b>Courses in German</b>	Apart from courses offered in English, incoming exchange students can also attend a variety of courses <b>taught</b> in German. Courses & FAQs for bachelor's and master's students: <a href="https://www.wu.ac.at/io/academics">https://www.wu.ac.at/io/academics</a>
<b>Class format</b>	Although WU has seven different examination types, approx. 90% of courses available to incoming exchange students are continuous assessment ("PI") courses. These courses are highly interactive courses including lectures, case studies, papers, presentations, and group projects. Exams and tests are held during the regular course sessions, and there is no special exam week at the end of the semester.
<b>Attendance and participation</b>	Attendance is mandatory in all continuous assessment courses ("PI"), which account for 90% of all courses at WU.
<b>Course registration</b>	WU's online registration system LPIS allows students to register for courses even if they overlap. As attendance is mandatory, it is the students' responsibility to only register for courses they can attend in full. Course registration is based on a first-come, first-served principle; therefore, we strongly recommend that students choose two back-up courses in case their registration for their preferred courses is not successful. Course numbers at WU have a purely administrative function and change every semester.
<b>Course load</b>	Students are expected to take a full workload at WU, which corresponds to 24 to 30 ECTS credits. The maximum course load is 36 ECTS credits excluding language courses.
<b>Exam dates</b>	<b>Exam dates</b> depend on the courses chosen. There is <b>no specific examination period</b> for all courses.

## German language courses

<b>Before the semester</b>	WU offers pre-semester German language courses with levels ranging from absolute beginners to highly advanced speakers. These two-week intensive language courses are principally free of charge. Only a fee for administration and teaching materials (€ 40) will be charged. To participate, students need to apply by May 15 for the winter semester and by November 15 for the summer semester. Places are limited.
<b>During the semester</b>	WU's Business Language Center offers German courses at all levels. For students, courses (30 contact hours) cost € 195.

## Documents

<b>Confirmation of Stay</b>	Please note that a <b>Confirmation of Stay</b> will only be issued for the <b>period of the student's actual studies at WU</b> . The Welcome Days that students participate in will be given as their date of arrival. The last day that can be confirmed on the Confirmation of Stay is the last day that students <b>need to be present at WU</b> (e.g. last day of classes, last exam).
<b>Transcript of records</b>	We will issue a transcript or grade report for each student at the end of the semester, which will be sent to the coordinator at the home university.
<b>Grading</b>	<p>The following grading scale applies at WU:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1 excellent (Sehr gut)</li><li>2 good (Gut)</li><li>3 satisfactory (Befriedigend)</li><li>4 sufficient (Genügend)</li><li>5 fail (Nicht genügend)</li></ol> <p>WU does not use a standardized percentage-based grading scale. The percentage scores needed to receive the grades given above differ from course to course. In most cases, the course-specific grading scales can be found in the course descriptions online.</p>

## Orientation services for exchange students

<b>Orientation and Cultural Program</b>	WU offers a two-week program, which includes a variety of activities such as social events, a sightseeing program, out-of-town field trips, presentations on Austria, etc. and costs € 260. To participate, students need to apply by May 15 for the winter semester and by November 15 for the summer semester. Places are limited.
<b>Academic advisors</b>	For each WU partner university, a specific WU faculty member acts as an academic advisor. Academic advisors support students in selecting appropriate courses and give advice on relevant academic matters.
<b>Buddy Network</b>	The Austrian Students' Union (ÖH) at WU are available to help exchange students find a "buddy" – a WU student who acts as their personal mentor. The Buddy Network also organizes a number of social activities for exchange students (skiing trips, trips to neighboring countries, theater evenings, etc.).



## Accommodation

### General information

Exchange students have **several options to choose from** when booking housing for their stay. These options include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Residence halls run by OeAD, the main housing provider for students in Austria
- A private flat that can be found for example through the housing platform Housing Anywhere
- Housing obtained through another third-party provider

### Staying in a student residence hall

WU has made pre-reservations in certain OeAD (Austrian Agency for International Cooperation in Education and Research) residence halls to make sure that housing is guaranteed for our incoming students. Students who would like to make use of this offer need to register through the [OeAD website](#) by May 15 (winter semester) or November 15 (summer semester) at the latest.

Please note that the minimum rental period for a room in an OeAD residency hall is a whole semester (winter semester: October to the end of January; summer semester: March to the end of June). It is possible to extend but not to shorten the rental period.

### Private accommodation

If students prefer to arrange their own accommodations, we recommend using the platform "Housing Anywhere" or any other of the databases listed on our website. If students need proof of accommodation for visa purposes, this proof has to be issued by the landlord.

## Entry and residence regulations

### General information

Before traveling to Austria, students should make sure they are familiar with the regulations concerning visas and residence permits.

Nationals of non-EU/EEA countries and Switzerland (so-called "third country nationals") need an entry visa or residence permit for entry into and residence in Austria. The type of permit depends on the length and purpose of the stay.

## International Summer University<sup>WU</sup>

### General information

As an alternative to a full exchange semester, WU offers intensive three-week programs. These **short academic programs** take place at WU from **July 5 – 23, 2021**, and **July 26 – August 13, 2021**. Students can attend two to three business courses on graduate or undergraduate level. All courses are taught in English and cover several business-related topics. Undergraduate students can earn 8 ECTS credits; graduate students can earn 9 ECTS credits.

The program includes networking opportunities and a cultural and social program with fellow students from over 25 countries. Course materials, lunch on lecture days, and the public transportation ticket for Vienna are included in the fees.

## IMC – WU Spring Program

### General information

The IMC – WU Spring Program is a joint intensive program for international bachelor's students, which is expected to take place in the last two weeks of May, at [IMC University of Applied Sciences Krems](#) and WU (Vienna University of Economics and Business).

The academic course aims at deepening the participants' knowledge in the field of marketing management in tourism. Latest trends and strategies, real-life project work and intercultural teamwork are the main pillars within the English-taught course. Participants can earn 6 ECTS credits for this course. The program fee includes course materials, lunch on lecture days, public transport in Vienna and Krems and a cultural and social program to intensify the networking opportunities with fellow students.
