I would like to welcome all the participants of the conference “Education and Global Cities: Horizons for Contemporary University”.

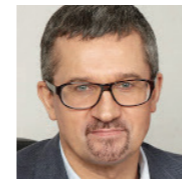

The modern university is facing new challenges and has to bring into action strategic planning as well as ensure its sustainable development considering the variety of missions and the escalation of budget and resources restrictions. The missions of a modern university are not confined to traditional education and research functions, but also include a wide range of social issues of the modern university (the so called the “third role” of the university) and the need for more active participation in regional and urban development (known as the “fourth role” of the university), the development of entrepreneurial and innovative activities in the so-called “knowledge triangle”, a more active and coherent cooperation with employers in response to the rapidly changing demands on graduates competency.

Plenary Session "Demand for Modern Qualifications: Moving towards a New Model of University and Labour Market Cooperation"

The professional qualifications level of people is a key factor in the socio-economic development and social well-being of both an individual and society as a whole. Round Table “Smart Cities: Cooperation of Universities and Cities”

Most foreign scholars researching issues of spatial development of universities agree that they can become one of the main places of “meeting” between the city and university, and evaluate how the potential of such a “meeting” can be used to stimulate economic development and growth management. Experience around the world shows that the creation of joint initiatives allows for the building of a creative and competitive urban space, which strengthens the position of the university and the city in the global economy. The development of campuses plays an important role in urban development, namely: universities contribute to the creation of new high-tech spaces, creating a completely new knowledge in regions and participating in the improvement of infrastructure. Universities contribute to improving the quality of urban management and the closer work with local authorities allows to improve urban planning system. Universities can contribute to the intangible development of the city, contributing to increasing the attractiveness of the city and the formation of its branding by engaging in strategic urban projects.

The participants are invited to deliberate on current trends in the development of “smart cities” as a center of intellectual development, using the capabilities of universities as centers of knowledge production and preparation of “smart citizens”, possibilities of Russian cities to be engaged in the global processes of “smart” urban development. Representatives of universities, federal and regional authorities, expert community are invited to the discussion.

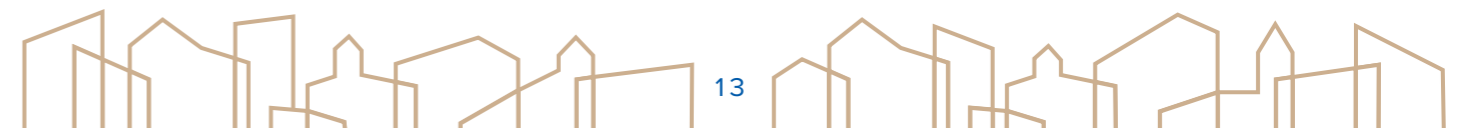

The roots of corruption are highly contested. Professor Uslaner presents theoretical arguments for the existence of a causal mechanism between universal education and control of corruption. His research demonstrates a powerful statistical link between education levels in 1870 and corruption levels in 2010 for 78 countries, a relationship that remains strong even when controlling for change in the level of education, gross national product per capita, and democratic governance. Historical levels of education reflect levels of equality across countries, which demonstrate strong “path dependence” over time. Uslaner traces early education to levels of economic equality in the late 19th and early 21st centuries — and argues that societies with more equality educated more of their citizens, which then gave their citizens more opportunities and power, reducing corruption. There is historical evidence from Europe and Spanish, British, and French colonies that strong states provided more education to their publics — and that such states were themselves more common where economic disparities were smaller.
