

Most foreign scholars researching issues of spatial development of universities agree that they can become one of the main places of "meeting" between the city and university, and evaluate how the potential of such a "meeting" can be used to stimulate economic development and growth management. Experience around the world shows that the creation of joint initiatives allows for the building of a creative and competitive urban space, which strengthens the position of the university and the city in the global economy. The development of campuses plays an important role in urban development, namely: universities contribute to the creation of new high-tech spaces, creating a completely new knowledge in regions and participating in the improvement of infrastructure. Universities contribute to improving the quality of urban management and the closer work with local authorities allows to improve urban planning system. Universities can contribute to the intangible development of the city, contributing to increasing the attractiveness of the city and the formation of its branding by engaging in strategic urban projects.

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








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
